


<u>GLENN COUNTY FAIR</u> HORSE SHOW

Remember...

Animal Ownership-

Breeding Animals: Must have been owned by and under the management and direct care of the exhibitor for no less than thirty (30) consecutive days prior to opening day of the Fair

Market Animals: Must have been owned by and under the management and direct care of the exhibitor for at least:

- Lamb, Hog & Goat—sixty (60) consecutive days prior to opening day of Fair
- **Beef**—one hundred twenty (120) consecutive days prior to opening day of the Fair
- **Poultry/Rabbits**—(30) consecutive days before the Meat Pens are judged

2010 Yuba-Sutter Fair Exhibitors

4-H Fair Eligibility Rules

In order to exhibit at the 2010 Yuba-Sutter Fair, all 4-H members must meet the following requirements:

- 80% or more attendance at club and project meeting of project which will be exhibited at the fair.
- Attendance at one or more Bi-County 4-H event.
- Presentation at appropriate club or county level.
 - \Rightarrow 1st-2nd year regular member may present at project, club or county level (primary members are exempt.)
 - \Rightarrow 3rd-5th year regular member may present at club or county level.
 - \Rightarrow 6th year + members must present at county level.

Clubs may have more strict rules, but not more lenient.

HELP WANTED! Camp Counselors & Chaperones

Camp Counselors: Must attend the planning meetings for Hi 4-H. If you cannot make the 3rd Monday of the Month @ 7pm, Hi 4-H meetings, please call Mary Hall at 743-2490 to be included in the scheduling.

Camp Chaperones: All clubs need to provide chaperones for 4-H summer Camp for the youth attending from their club. The ratio is **1** adult for every 10 campers. So, if 5

boys and 8 girls register from the same club, the club would need to provide one male <u>and</u> one female chaperone. There must be 1 chaperone for each primary member in attendance.

 $\frac{1}{2}$ Policy does not permit admitting more youth than there is sufficient supervision by an adequate number of $\frac{1}{2}$ chaperones. Clubs can encourage leaders to serve as chaperones by paying their camp registration fee.

All chaperones must be 25 years of age, be enrolled in 4-H, have their finger prints CLEARED, and attend a camp chaperone orientation on Tuesday, June 1st at 5:30 pm @ the 4-H Office.


