State 4-H Record Book Competition

Senior 4-H members (at least 14 years of age and no older than 19 years old by December 31st of the program year for which the book is being entered) are eligible to enter state competition. State compe-

tition is focused on selecting 4-H members who have demonstrated outstanding achievements in their 4-H project work. Books are judged against standard criteria and those books displaying the most outstanding 4-H work, life skills development, leadership and citizenship development are selected as State Medalist and/or State Winner. State Record Book competition provides an incentive to member to record their project work in their 4-H Record Book, receive feedback and encouragement on their 4-H project skill development, leadership and citizenship development, and record-keeping skills and are recognized for outstanding 4-H work.. Record Books are due to 4 -H Office for State judging by October 21, 2011.
