- Club Project Enrollment by December 31, 2011
- Attendance of 80% or higher at club and project meeting of • projects which will be exhibited at fair.
- Attendance at one or more Bi-County 4-H event. •
- Presentation at appropriate club or county level.
 - \Rightarrow 1st 2nd year regular members may present at project. club or county level (primary members are exempt.)
 - \Rightarrow 3rd 5th year regular members must present at club or county level.
 - \Rightarrow 6th year + members must present at county level.

Clubs may have more strict rules, but not more lenient.
