4-H Fair Eligibility Rules

In order to exhibit at the 2013 Yuba Sutter Fair, all 4-H members must meet the following requirements:

- Club Project Enrollment by November 30, 2012
- Attendance of 80% or higher at club and project meetings of projects which will be exhibited at fair
- Attendance at one or more Bi-County 4-H event
- Presentation at appropriate club or county level
- \Rightarrow 1st 2nd year regular members may present at project , club or county level (primary members are exempt.)
- \Rightarrow 3rd 5th year regular members must present at club or county level
- \Rightarrow 6th year + members must present at county level

Clubs may have more strict rules, but not more lenient.

State 4-H Fashion Revue 🥑 🕵

The State 4-H Fashion Revue committee announces categories and service projects for 2013 SFR! Entries this year will be:

- ◆ **Traditional:** new this year, the entry must be sewn by the member as part of his/her 4-H Clothing and Textile project.
- Consumer Science Purchased has a \$19.99 limit, shoes and sales tax not included. Receipts for all items showing except shoes are required, with purchases made during the 2012-2013 4
 H year. The \$100 CS Purchased category will not be offered.
- Wearable Art-Embellished entry must start with a purchased garment. Duct tape entries are not eligible for WA-Embellished.
- ◆ 2 Yard Wonder is a Challenge Category: using 2 yards of 100% cotton fabric, sew a garment and an accessory. You can use less fabric but not more for this garment and the accessory. There is no specific pattern requirement. Take a "before" photo holding the yardage and an "after" photo wearing the outfit. The entry must be sewn by the member as part of his/her 4-H Clothing & Textiles project.
- ◆ Duct Tape Challenge: Create a wearable garment out of duck tape such as a jacket, shirt, pants, skirt or dress. The member may choose to begin with a purchased garment or not. Additional garments, accessories, fabric and materials may be added.

State Fashion Revue is coordinating three service projects.

- 1) Little dresses and shorts for Africa
- 2) Stuffed animals
- 3) Drawstring bags
