




HOW TO MAKE A MOTION

Parliamentary Procedures



4-H meetings are conducted following the rules of Parliamentary Procedure. In Parliamentary Procedure, decisions are made by a motion. This is called a "main motion". A main motion may be discussed, postponed, rejected, withdrawn or referred to a committee. Ac-

tion on a motion requires a vote from the group.

If a member wants to make a motion they should proceed as follows:

- Wait for the President to call upon you, then state the motion by saying, "I move that _____."
- Another member may then second the motion.
- Then the motion is stated in full by the President, "It has been moved and seconded that (restate the motion). Is there any discussion?"
- Following discussion, or if there is no discussion, the President will ask, "All those in favor." Members will respond "aye" for yes and "no" for no.
- If the motion passes, the President says, "Motion passes."

FUNDRAISING TIP OF THE MONTH:Thanking and retaining Your Donors: Stewardship

Stewardship is more than thanking your donors. If done properly, it will keep your relationship with your supporters strong and growing so that you can go back to them for additional gifts in the future. Other important steps to keep your donor connected and reassured that giving their money and time was a wise choice, include:

- Spending the money as agreed
- Managing the funds prudently
- Demonstrating significance and impact
 - Stories to illustrate how their support helped
 - Updates that describe the impact that your project has made
 - Invitation to your donors to come to an end-of-the-project celebration where you can honor them for their support

The State 4-H Fashion Revue committee announces categories and service projects for 2013 SFR! Entries this year will be:

- 1) Little dresses and shorts for Africa (instructions)
- 2) Stuffed animals
- 3) Drawstring bags (flyer & instructions)
- ◆ **Traditional:** new this year, the entry must be sewn by the member as part of his/her 4-H Clothing and Textile project.
- ◆ Consumer Science Purchased has a \$19.99 limit, shoes and sales tax not included. Receipts for all items showing except shoes are required, with purchases made during the 2012-2013 4-H year. The \$100 CS Purchased category will not be offered.
- ♦ Wearable Art-Embellished entry must start with a purchased garment. Duct tape entries are not eligible for WA-Embellished.
- ◆ 2 Yard Wonder is a Challenge Category: a garment and coordinating accessory are created out of a two yard length of 45" wide woven cotton fabric. For the garment and accessory, only this piece of fabric may be used (for example, no additional fabric for lining).
- ◆ Duct Tape Challenge: Create a wearable garment out of duck tape such as a jacket, shirt, pants, skirt or dress. The member may choose to begin with a purchased garment or not. Additional garments, accessories, fabric and materials may be added.

In order to exhibit at the 2013 Yuba Sutter Fair ALL 4-H members must meet the following requirements:



- Club Project Enrollment by November 30, 2012
- Attendance of 80% or higher at club and project meetings of projects which will be exhibited at fair
- Attendance at one or more Bi-County 4-H event
- Presentation at appropriate club or county level
 - ⇒ 1st 2nd year regular members may present at project, club or county level (primary members are exempt.)
 - ⇒ 3rd 5th year regular members must present at club or county level
 - ⇒ 6th year + members must present at county level

Clubs may have more strict rules, but not more lenient.
