Whether or not youth complete a record book online they can still enter the system, take the surveys, and networks with out youth in their club or group. When youth take surveys they get "Spark Points" and are eligible to receive other incentives including a gift card, centennial pin, or iPad Mini.

Youth who submit an Online Record Book to State Record Book Competition will receive

a special edition "Got ORB" T-Shirt.

New Support for Record Book Competition: To help youth and adults understand some specific requirements to submit a successful book to State Competition, a Quick Start Record Book course is available. This 20 minute online course will help youth and adults navigate the Record Book Manual. Look for the course on the State website in the Record Book Resources All youth who plan to submit a Record Book to State Competition will be required to complete this course by October 31st of the year that they are submitting a book.

# The Ten Commandments for Parents of Youngsters Showing Livestock

California State Fair

\* July 12th - 28th 2013 \*

By: Mr. Clyde D. Lane Jr. Extension Specialist, University of Tennessee

- Thou shalt not feed, train, and care for the animal for thou are trying to teach thy child responsibility
- Thou shalt forgive a child for making mistakes in the show ring for thou hast made mistakes too
- 3. Thou shalt not get mad when thy child forgets items in the show box, for one day thou may forget the show box.
- 4. Thou shalt help the show management for they are doing a job that thou would not want to do.
- Thou shalt see that thy child is on time for all activities for thou would not want to wait for others.
- 6. Thou shalt make sure thy child has animals entered and registration papers in order by the designated time.
- 7. Thou shalt teach thy child that winning a blue ribbon is a desirable goal but making friends along the way is a more worthy goal.
- 8. Thou shalt not complain about the judge for it is his/her opinion that has been sought.
- Thou shalt remember that livestock projects are teaching projects, not necessarily moneymaking projects.
- Thou shalt remember that the livestock project is a family project that shall be enjoyed and supported by the entire family.

## 4-H Fair Eligibility Rules

In order to exhibit at the 2013 Yuba Sutter Fair ALL 4-H members must meet the following requirements:



- Club Project Enrollment by November 30, 2012
- Attendance of 80% or higher at club and project meetings of projects which will be exhibited at fair
- Attendance at one or more Bi-County 4-H event
- Presentation at appropriate club or county level
  - ⇒ 1st 2nd year regular members may present at project, club or county level (primary members are exempt.)
  - ⇒ 3rd 5th year regular members must present at club or county level
  - ⇒ 6th year + members must present at county level

Clubs may have more strict rules, but not more lenient.
