RE-ENROLLING YOUTH MEMBERS & ADULT VOLUNTEERS:

Whether or not you have enrolled in 4-H online in the past, you are already in the online system. You must simply log in and update your information when you re-enroll in 4-H.

1. Go to California.4honline.com, choose "**I have a profile.**" Log in using the email address (even if it is not a valid email any longer) and password you used last year. If you forgot, lost or never had a password choose "**I forgot my password.**" A temporary password will be emailed to you. You can also call the 4-H office and we can reset your password.
2. Once logged in, locate the name of each re-enrollment youth/adult on the screen. Click "**Edit**" at the far right of each name.
3. Click "**Enroll for the 2013-2014**". On each page verify that all the information is correct and update the club and projects. *(Projects offered may change according to the volunteers in our club.)*
4. Repeat steps 2– 3 for each enrolling youth and adult in your immediate family under your family's account.
5. Print and submit the medical forms along with enrollments fees (**made payable to your club**) to your club leader or enrollment coordinator.

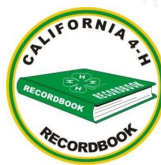

VOLUNTEER HELP NEEDED

The Jr. Livestock Advisory Auction Committee is currently recruiting clerks and volunteers for the 2013 Yuba-Sutter Fair Jr. Livestock Auction on Saturday, August 3rd. Adult help is needed with the following tasks:

- **Table Clerks:** 4 needed for Hog ring. Buyers placards, Recording of Buyers/ Prices, Preparing Buyers Sheets for signatures. Steer/Lamb side is filled.
- **Spotters:** 1-2 Spotters for beef/lamb side, 2-3 spotters for Hog side: Keep track of locations of buyers in the crowd in order to direct youth to the correct person.
- **Ring Men:** At least 3 on each side (Bid Takers)
- **Volunteers:** 2 People to stand outside the gate of the rights to make sure the right animal is coming in.

If you or someone you know can help with any of these tasks, please contact the 4-H Office by July 8th.

A judge will taste all courses prepared and the winners of each round will then compete at 4 pm each day to determine the daily 4-H Throwdown Champion. 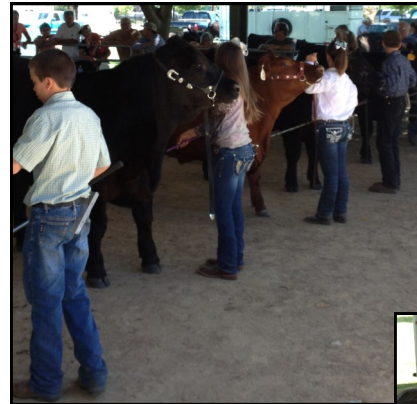

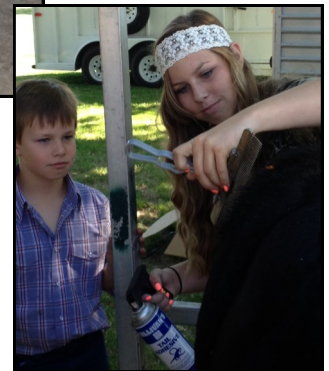
