- 1) Complete online application, which includes:
  - → Waiver (online)
  - → Medical Treatment form (printed and turned in to club leader)
  - → Self Disclosure (online)
  - → Pay fees (turned in to club leader) Fee this year is \$16
- 2) County 4-H staff review
- 3) County director reviews the application and approves appointment
- 4) Leaders receive appointment letter along with a leaders card for an one year appointment.

To become a certified 4-H leader adults must complete the following three steps:

- The online application and be approved;
- Complete a DOJ fingerprinting; and
- Attend a new leader orientation
