The service of safe food should be a priority at all 4-H meetings, events, and fundraisers. Any activity where food is served (potluck, concession stand, bake sale, etc.) has the risk of food borne illness.

If your club is planning on conducting any activity that involves serving or handling food, please encourage all youth and adults involved to complete the Food Safety online training. The training takes about an hour to complete. It can be done all at once or can be done section by section at your leisure. A Certificate of Completion is given to each person who completes the training. The certificate is good for 3 years.

Prizes will be awarded at the November Leaders Council meeting.

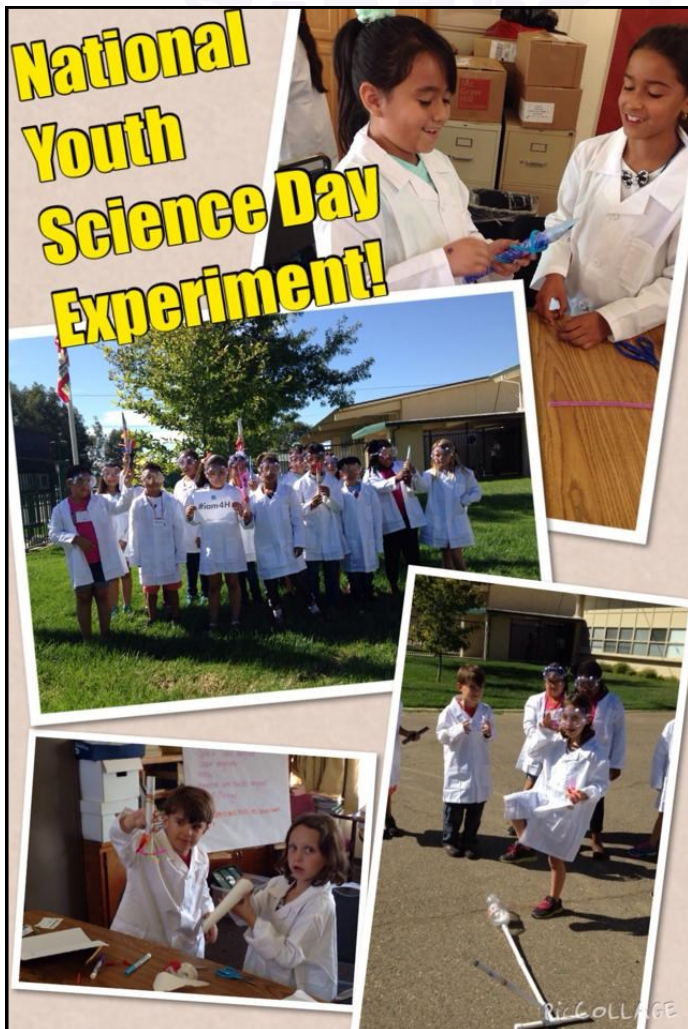
