NEWS YOU CAN USE

Message from Emily Schoenfelder ~ 4-H Youth Development Advisor Intercultural Development Conference

Last week, I had the pleasure of attending a conference focused on Intercultural Development. The conference was just

one part of a larger initiative designed to ensure that the California 4-H Youth Development Program is representative of California as a whole. As 4-H receives funding from the federal, state, and county levels, it is vital that our program is open, welcoming, and relevant to all who live here. Plus, we want to give as many kids as possible the opportunity to grow and learn in a safe environment!

While participating in the conference, I was enlightened and engaged in learning how the culture in which we live influences so much of who we are, the way we think, and how we make decisions. Think about the following questions:

- If something at school or work upset you, would you openly express your feelings?
- Should the amount of respect given to someone be related to their family background?
- If your teacher or boss was leading a workshop and accidentally giving out incorrect information, would you correct them right then, or wait until you were one on one?

There is no right or wrong answer to these questions. However, the way you answer them is probably based on values held by your culture.

At the conference, we were encouraged to go beyond the Golden Rule: treat others how you want to be treated. Instead, we were challenged to utilize the Platinum Rule: treat others as *they* want to be treated. This takes into account that our way of viewing the world is not the only way of viewing the world. The Platinum Rule understands that different people and different cultures have varying expectations of what may constitute polite behavior, professionalism, problem solving, or even punctuality. As we move forward, I am excited to use this and other principles to reach more kids, and to teach our members how to be kind in any culture.

IMPORTANT: Financial Policy Reminders

Each club's bank statement is reviewed, monthly, by the 4-H Program Representative AND the County Director. The purpose of the monthly review is to ensure that our clubs are operating in compliance with University and 4-H policy. Below are a few "trouble spots" that have been found while reviewing the bank statements. Please review these policies to make sure your club is in compliance.

Chapter 9. XII. Disbursements - http://4h.ucanr.edu/Resources/Policies/Chapter9/

A. Procedures (checks writing)

All expenditures must be made from established 4-H club 4. For budgeted items, the treasurer should make payments only with proper documentation suc

- Decisions concerning the disbursement of funds by a 4-H club or Council are to be made by the membership of the club or Council.
- 2. Financial commitments and expenditures must be in accordance with the policies established in the *4-H Policy Handbook* and with the 4-H club's or Council's approved budget.
- 3. If expenses are incurred for non-budgeted items, these expenses should not be paid until after the 4-H club or Council formally approves the unbudgeted

expenditure.

- 4. For budgeted items, the treasurer should make payments only with proper documentation such as a purchase order, receipt, invoice or other supporting documentation.
- 5. All checks must bear the signatures of two unrelated persons authorized and designated as signatories by the club or Council. The signer may not be the same person as the payee.
- 6. The check memo must include the purpose of payment.
