






### 2016 County 4-H Fashion Revue - QUILT CHALLENGE UPDATE

### **CLOVER SAFE #19 HEAT ILLNESS AWARENESS**

According to the National Weather Service, an average of 235 heat-related fatalities occurred annually between 1975 and 2004. Moreover, about 25,000 heat-related illnesses or injuries occurred from 1991-2000. Children are at greater risk for heat stress because their bodies have a larger surface area per pound of weight. Youth that are vigorously exerting themselves in summer heat are at higher risk for contracting heat illness. By taking several simple precautions, people can control and/or reduce exposure to conditions that may cause heat illness.

This exciting activity will combine a speeding car collision and a distracted diving demonstration in a simulated activity that investigates the physical and human factors of motion. Motion Commotion will enable youth to explore the physics of motion and distracted driving. The two part experiment will test young people's knowledge of science, speed and safety by:

- 1. A simulated runway to analyze the speed, momentum and kinetic energy of a car in motion, and will explore the science behind the car's collisions
- 2. Learning an experiment that uses the same physics principles to demonstrate the consequences of distractions in everyday life.



This definition is never more real to me than when I watch 4-H volunteers in action.

Over the past several months, I've worked with project leaders who volunteered to pilot a new Bio-Security curriculum and research project. These individuals have given extra time and energy to attend workshops and webinars, learning new ways of teaching youth members to keep 4-H animals healthy and safe from potential disease. Their remarkable commitment will continue through fair, where we will collect information from many members to help UC Davis Vet School and 4-H continue to ensure animal health. Moreover, the grant money accompanying this project will help to keep the fees of all Sutter-Yuba members and volunteers at the current level, rather than increasing with the state increases.

Plus, last month I witnessed a dedicated group of adults give up nearly an entire week of their year at 4-H Summer Camp. Led by the amazing Camp Director, Erin Cucchi, these volunteers braved the elements - weather, bugs, mountain lions, and spotty cell reception – to give a gaggle of 4-H youngsters 5 days of fun!

Finally, I saw the wonderful Spring Fair Committee plan and implement their annual event, patiently walking me through the process as they went. Their flawless execution provided learning opportunities and practice for participants. Several members were able to show animals or exhibits for the first time, working out their jitters in a safe and supportive environment.


