A few things to remember when completing your 4-H online enrollment:

- 1. All forms and fees must be turned in to your community club leader by **November 1st** and must be confirmed by your club leader by November 30
- 2. Fees for the 2015-2016 4-H program year are \$60 for youth and \$16 for adults
- 3. If you plan to show an animal at the 2016 Fair be sure to check the Fair Eligibility Rules for 4-Hers



FAIR ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR 4-HERS

In order to exhibit at the **2016 Yuba-Sutter Fair**, all 4-H members must meet the following requirements:

- Online Enrollment confirmed by Nov 30, 2015
- Attendance of 80% or higher at club project meeting of projects which will be exhibited at fair
- Attendance at one or more Bi-County
 4-H event



- 1st-2nd year regular members may present at project, club or county level (primary member are exempt)
- √ 3rd-5th year regular members must present at club or county level
- √ 6th+ year regular members must present at county level



Clubs may have more strict rules but not more lenient.



CLOVER SAFE NOTES

CLOVER SAFE #42 | BICYCLING SAFETY



Information available from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission indicate more than 200,000 youth aged eight through 19 were treated in hospitals for bicycling-related injuries during 2006. The most frequent types of injuries were abrasions/contusions, fractures, lacerations, and sprains/strains. The common body parts injured, in decreasing order of occurrence, were the head, wrist, knee, lower leg, and shoulder. Many of these injuries could have been prevented by taking several simple precautions when bicycling.

2016 State Fashion Revue News

Announcing State Fashion Revue 2016, "Hoe Down, Sew Down." Participant categories returning for 2016 are Traditional, Upcycled, and Consumer Science Purchased \$40 limit. The rules for the Upcycled have been modified to place more emphasis on the transition. There are two new challenge categories. In the Western Wear Challenge, sewing project members make a western shirt and add other sewn or purchased garments to complete an outfit. For the Muslin Challenge, members create a



garment out of at least 2 but not more than 3 yards of cotton muslin fabric. It must be made as part of a member's project work but the Clothing & Textiles/Sewing project isn't required. Members are encouraged to decorate or embellish the garment. Additional garments may be handmade or purchased. The first service project announced is reusable tote bags made of feed bags, left over sturdy fabric, or canvas or even denim. The second service project will be announced next month. - Constructing a simulated runway to analyze the speed, momentum and kinetic energy of a car in motion, and will explore the science behind the car's collisions
- Leading an experiment that uses the same physics principles to demonstrate the consequences of distractions in everyday life




