Youth members and adult volunteers may enroll at any time during the year. **Deadline** to be eligible for **Yuba-Sutter Fair in 2019**:


- Members must be enrolled by November 1, 2018

4-H Record Books

Two ways to do the 4-H Record Book

- 1. Online Record Book (ORB)
- 2. Paper Record Book

Both versions are aligned with the same forms and follow the same instructions for completion. You can use either version as your Record Book.

Do I have to do a Record Book?

We encourage all our 4-H youth to do a Record Book

to record their project information and reflections, but 4-H

Record Books **are not** required for membership or participation in 4-H activities. Completing a Record Book is a good way to track your progress throughout your years in 4-H but most importantly it is required to receive participation awards such as star ranking, medals, and or pins based on 4-H Record Book achievements.

The Online Record Book (ORB)

The 4-H Online Record Book (ORB) provides you with an interactive way to maintain records online and stay connected to the 4-H Community. The ORB is aligned with the paper versions of the Record Book.

Log in to ORB

Use your 4hOnline login to log in to ORB.

Paper Record Book

Paper Record Books use the forms and manual. The paper and online record books are aligned; both the online and paper versions use the same instructions.

Record Book Manual—this manual outlines all the parts of the Record Book and includes instructions for completing each form.

Record Book Forms—contains all the forms for 4-H members using a

paper Record Book. This version allows you to complete the forms directly into the document and

expand the rows as needed.
