## IMPORTANT-NEW THIS YEAR

Sutter-Yuba 4-H Presentation/Leadership Requirements for Fair Participation

For

## Senior Members with 6 or more years of membership as a Regular Member (Primary years do not count)

Members are required to complete one requirement from either **Option #1 PRESENTATIONS** or **Option #2 LEADERSHIP ROLE** each year to be eligible to show at the Yuba Sutter Fair.

## **Option #1 PRESENTATIONS (CHOOSE ONE)**

- **Presentation** at Bi-County Presentation Day (Presentation must adhere to the State Presentation Requirements)
- **Room Coordinator** for Bi-County Presentation Day or Area Presentation Day
- MC/Tabulator for Bi-County Presentation Day or Area Presentation Day
- Youth Evaluator for Bi-County Presentation Day or Sectional Presentation Day
- **4-H Presentation on a 4-H related topic at a Civic Organization** (Presentation must adhere to the State Presentation Requirements)
- Educational Presentation at Spring Fair on a 4-H related topic (Presentation must adhere to the State Presentation Requirements)
- MC at Bi-County Achievement Night (must follow speaker guidelines)
- Commentator at Bi-County Fashion Revue (must follow speaker guidelines)

## OR

## **Option #2 SIGNIFICANT LEADERSHIP ROLE (CHOOSE ONE)**

6th+ year regular member must utilize their pubic speaking knowledge and leadership skills at the county level. Member must participate in the planning of a county 4-H event by being an active member of a county committee. Leadership roles available to teens are:

- **County Council Member**—Attend 4 of the 5 County 4-H Council meetings and take a leadership role as a youth partner.
- **Spring Fair Committee**—Serve on the planning committee to plan Spring Fair and actively help at event as a youth partner.
- Fashion Revue Committee—Serve on the planning committee to plan Fashion Revue and actively help at the event as a youth partner.
- **Other Major County Committee**—Serve on the committee to plan any other major county event (ie Color Me Green, Achievement Night, Parades, Fair Booth) and actively help at event as a youth partner.
- **Camp Counselor**—Attend camp planning meetings and be a color group leader, a daily leader, or campfire leader at camp.
- **Camp Rotation Presentation**—Present a 30 minutes class (rotation) three times to a group of 30-40 campers.
- **Coordinating Large 4-H Community Service Project/Event**—Work as the lead in coordinating a large 4-H Community Service Project or Event—this event must be signed off by your 4-H Community Club leader and/or the 4-H Program Representative.
- **Outreach Committee**—Work with the 4-H Office to provide 4-H Activities at communities events Yuba and Sutter Counties. Examples are: Beale AFB 4-H Day, Farm Day, Sutter County Haunted Health Fair, and the United Way Resource Fair.
- 4-H County Ambassador

*This section cannot have double credit, i.e. if working on a large project for Emerald Star it cannot count for this requirement a well.*

## SUTTER-YUBA 4-H FAIR ELIGIBILITY POLICY

In order to exhibit at the 2019 Yuba-Sutter Fair, all 4-H members must meet the following requirements:

- Individuals must be enrolled in 4-H (online) and in the appropriate project prior to November 1, 2018. Online enrollment must be confirmed by the Community Club leader by November 30, 2018.
- Regular members (primary members are exempt) must give **one verbal presentation** at the appropriate club or county level
  - **1st-2nd year regular members** must present at either project, club or county level
  - 3rd-5th year regular members must present at club or county level
  - 6th+ year regular members must present at county OR actively participate in a significant county leadership role
- Members must attend 80% or more of the community club meetings.
- Members must attend 80% or more of club project meetings for the project to be exhibited at fair
- Each member must participate in at least one bi-county/area event.
- Complete Project Completion requirements as outlined in the <u>Steps to Success in 4-H</u>.

## SHOOTING SPORTS WORKSHOPS

- 18th Annual Don Haglund Memorial Air Rifle Invitational Match—Saturday, March 2, 2019 | Match begins at 9:00 am | Location: Staislaus County Sheriffs Canine Training Center, Modesto, CA. Registration Form and Members list by class and with shirt sizes MUST be in by the January 21, 2019 County Shooting Sports Leaders Meeting. - 2. Rifle Discipline Workshop—Saturday, February 16 & 17, 2019 | Bakersfield, CA A 4-H Shooing sports workshop for the rifle discipline will be held at the UC Cooperatives Extension Office, 1031 S. Mt. Vernon Avenue in Bakersfield. Participants must attend both days of training to receive certification. Upon successful completion of the course, the participants will be certified as a rifle training and can lead a rifle project at the cub level or serve as a county training to certify other leaders. There is no cost for the course. To register for the course or receive more information, contact John Borba at jaborba@ucanr.edu.
- 3. 35th Annual California 4-H (Mail In) Shooting Sports Match—March 4, 2019 | 8:00am—5:00 pm Siskiyou County 4-H Leaders Council will host the 2019 State 4-H Shooting Sports Match. The following is a list of procedures and rules for participation in the 2019 State 4-H Shooting Match. The registration process is as follows: All registration forms must be sent to the UCCE office of the county in which each participating 4-H club resides. Each club's registration check shall be made out to the local county's 4-H council, and should cover the total number of category entries times the entry fee of \$4.50 per category entry. The county 4-H Youth Development Advisor, 4-H Program Representative or other UCCE 4-H authorized individual shall sign the registration form to verify that all entrants, adults and youth, are currently enrolled in 4-H. On or before the postmark date of March 4, 2019, the UCCE 4-H office personnel shall send the registration forms and one single check per county to the Siskiyou County Leaders Council, 1655 South Main Street, Yreka, CA 96097. After receiving and processing the registration packets from each county, labeled targets and skeet/ trap score sheets will be mailed to the participating shooting sports leaders by April 12, 2019. A California 4-H State certified Shooting Sports Leader must supervise all shooting (Leaders must be certified in the discipline of the category of the target being verified, i.e., leaders certified in Rifle may supervise rifle events, Shotgun leaders may supervise trap events, etc.). For more information on becoming certified in the various disciplines, go to <u>http://www.ca4h.org/Projects/SET/ShootingSports/</u> After scoring the returned targets, the results will be compiled and distributed through the UCCE offices. Ribbons, medals and trophies will be sent to the participating counties for the shooting sports leaders to distribute. # **4-H RECORD BOOKS**

#### **Record Book Competitions**

Record Books can be submitted for review and evaluation at the Club, County and State level.

#### **Club Review**

4-H Record Books are first reviewed at the local level by 4-H Community Club/Unit Leaders and Project Leaders. Club level evaluation is based on the Danish system where 4-H Record Books are judged against a standard. Seals are awarded based on the member's 4-H project

work, personal growth and the book's organization. Through their personal achievements and 4-H participation, members may earn Star Rank recognition.

The Incentives and Recognition Advisory Committee provides a state approved Record Book Evaluation form for Club use. All 4-H Clubs that host a Record Book review must use this evaluation form.

Instructions for how to administer the Club Record Book evaluation are available from the county UCCE 4-H office. <u>Club Evaluation Worksheet</u>

#### **County Competition**

Members may submit their 4-H Record Books for county competition. Books are evaluated on the member's 4-H work, leadership and citizenship development, and personal growth. County level evaluation should be based on the Danish system with all books judged against a standard. Evaluators provide a critique and suggestions for future growth and involvement.

Sutter-Yuba Counties Record Book Judging is in July.



#### State Record Book Competition

The State Record Book competition is focused on selecting senior 4-H members who have demonstrated a well-rounded 4-H experience. Books are judged against standard criteria. Those books recording the most outstanding 4-H work, goal management skills, and leadership and citizenship development are selected as state medalists and/or state winners.

Eligibility for State Competition—If the criteria for eligibility aren't met, a member's book will be disqualified for the competition.

- Age Eligibility: Senior 4-H members (at least 14 years of age and no older than 19 years old by December 31 of the program year for which the book is being entered) are eligible to enter state competition.
- Use of Correct Forms: Members who are planning to submit their Record Book to state competition must download and use the most current forms, found on this website. One way to be sure to do this is to always download the latest version of the Record Book Manual and forms from the state website.
- Intent to Submit: This form is a recent addition to the State 4-H Record Book Judging Process. Members who are planning to submit their Record Book to state competition must <u>complete</u> <u>this form</u> by August 31st of the current program year.
- State 4-H Cover Page The State 4-H Judging Cover Page must be included with 4-H Record Books entered for State Evaluation. The Cover Page may not be altered.

#### **Record Book Competition Cover Sheet**

• **County Check Sheet** - A county check sheet must be included with 4-H Record Books entered for State Evaluation. 4-H Staff from the County 4-H Cooperative Extension Office, must complete the checklist and ensure the completeness of the 4-H Record Book.

#### County Check Sheet

• **Previous Years Materials** - Materials from all previous years in 4-H must be removed and replaced with a 4-H Resume. More information is available in the 2017-2018 4-H Record Book Manual and on <u>the 4-H Resume web page</u>.

The purpose of the 4-H Record Book—Reflect on your year work by documenting your skill development, learning experiences and growth in 4-H. To set goats, pursue strategies to meet those goals and shift gears in the face of challenges and obstacles. Be awarded for your involvement in 4-H activities and earn star ranks. Build competency through creating and preserving your records. Help you grow through continued exposure to positive experiences that support your development of the 6 Cs: competence, confidence, character, caring, connection and contribution.
