The 2019 National Youth Science Day (NYSC

Challenge is called Game Changers. Game Changers teaches kids how to use computer science to create games, solve problems and engage with topics they care passionately about.



The challenge consists of three multi-part activities, each of which draws career and real-world connections between computer science and 4-H's non-

STEM pillar area—Civic engagement, healthy living and agriculture. The challenge includes one computer-based and two unplugged activities: Pitch Your Passion, Program Youth Playground and Hack Your Harvest. Game Changers kits will go on sale starting in July.

Smithsonian Journey through an Exploded Star 3D Interactive Experience

Designed for use by both general audiences and high school age science groups the free materials are available at <u>s.si.edu/supernova</u> and include:

- An online interactive simulation in which users navigate the fiery remains of a supernova and manipulate the real data to make their own visualization of the cosmos.
- A 360-degree video tour explains how and why scientists study supernovas such as Cassiopeia A: to gain a comprehensive picture of these cosmic explosions.
- A high school level multimedia instructional package begins with the fundamentals of the electromagnetic spectrum and illustrate the production of elements from the explosions of starts (aligned to Next Generation Service Standards).

Snap the Gap

Earlier this year UC Davis received a grant from Disney to launch a program called <u>SNAP THE GAP</u>. Snap the Gap is currently recruiting sites and mentor for their 2019 pilot program in California. They have two sessions kicking off this year. One in July and the other in September. 

All of your previous years reports can be inserted at the back of the current year's book, in reverse chronological order (that means by year and the year you started in the back and you work forward to the current year in the front) or you can have a separate book for each year—the option is up to you. Some county competitions want to see all of your previous records—so be sure to find out what your county wants before you compete.

DEAR LEADERS,

Check these dates out! This course is required before you can be re-appointed as a leader every year. (You can watch one of these webinars with a group as long as everyone registers *individually.*) The returning volunteer course takes approximately 30 minutes and the new volunteer course takes approximately 2 hours and 15 minutes. To be a returning volunteer you must register and take the course by December 31, 2019.

These courses can still be done on your own but this gives you another option that for some might be easier.
