

### **Sutter-Yuba 4-H Fair Eligibility Policy**

In order to exhibit at the 2023 Yuba-Sutter Fair, all 4-H members must meet the following requirements:

- Individuals must be enrolled in 4hOnline and in the appropriate project prior to November 1, 2022. Online enrollment must be confirmed by the Community Club leader by November 30, 2022.
- Members must attend 80% or more of the community club meetings.
- **Each member must participate** in at least **one** bi-county event.
- Regular members (primary members are exempt) must give one verbal presentation at the appropriate club or county level
  - 1st—2nd year regular members must present at either project, club or county level
  - □ 3rd—5th year regular members must present at club or county level
  - 6th+ year regular member must present at county OR actively participate in a significant county leadership role
- Members must attend 80% or more of club project meetings for the project to be exhibited at fair.
- Complete Project Completion requirements as outlined in the <u>Steps to Success in 4-H</u>.


