Dr. Matthew Rodriguez, 4-H Youth Development Advisor at the 2022 Regional 4-H Champions Network meeting in Madison, WI

Our new 4-H Youth Development Advisor, Dr. Matthew Rodriguez attended the 4-H Champions Network meeting in Madison Wisconsin to discuss innovative ways to implement the 4-H Thriving Model of positive youth development at the national, state, and county levels. Matt was excited to learn about the 4-H Thriving Model and the theories of its framework. Key to the to the model is the concept of a youth's "spark," which is defined as a "passion for a selfidentified interest or skill. The model illustrates the process of positive youth development in 4-H

programs by connecting high quality program settings to the promotion of youth thriving.


Marysville Christmas Parade—December 3rd

- ☐ Attend **one Bi-County Event**.
- ☐ Complete **6 hours of training in the project exhibited** at Fair.

UC ANR 4-H AB2571 FAQ sheet update October 21, 2022

Recently UC ANR 4-H updated the **FAQ** with information about **AB160** that modified the statue to specifically exclude, among other things, educational youth shooting sports programs like 4-H. The **updated FAQ can be found on here** on the California 4-H website. In short, AB 160 (Public Safety Trailer Bill) was passed on on September 29, 2022 and amends the language contained in AB 2571. The amended language provides an exemption for "any advertising that is offering or promoting classes or events related to firearm safety, hunting, or sport shooting, as specified, or promoting membership in any organization."

We hope this helps volunteers as they plan their 4-H Shooting Sports Projects for the 2022-2023 4-H year.
