
Spring Arts and Craft Workshop

TAX DEDUCTIONS FOR LEADERS

Tax season is just around the corner again. There are certain contributions, if made to the 4H program, that are deductible for Federal Income Tax purposes.

- Amounts spent for fees, materials, awards, travel expenses(including meals, lodging) are deductible when not reimbursed.
- Cash contributions
- Cost of raising a Guide Dog Puppy
- The fair market value of property and materials donated to 4H

Generally, out of pocket expenses and property donations are deductible as contributions. These must be incurred in connection with service to 4H and the record should be kept which includes the date of the donation and the amount of the fair market value of the goods contributed. Always keep all receipts and cancelled checks to support your contributions. You may not claim the value of your volunteer services, time or cost of transporting or paying expenses for your own child. For more information consult with you tax advisor.
