2010 Yuba-Sutter Fair Exhibitors

4-H Fair Eligibility Rules

In order to exhibit at the 2010 Yuba-Sutter Fair, all 4-H members must meet the following requirements:

- 80% or more attendance at club and project meeting of project which will be exhibited at the fair.
- Attendance at one or more Bi-County 4-H event. (See page 4 for the list of approved events.)
- Presentation at appropriate club or county level.
 - ⇒ 1st-2nd year regular member may present at project, club or county level (primary members are exempt.)
 - 3rd-5th year regular member may present at club or county level.
 - ⇒ 6th year + members must present at county level.

Clubs may have more strict rules, but not more lenient.

AWARD SPONSORSHIPS NEEDED!

The Junior Livestock Committee of the Yuba-Sutter Fair is seeking sponsorships for all livestock awards.

Most of the sponsorships are either \$50 or \$100 and include showmanship and champion awards for most livestock species. Additional awards are being given to include species that have not been awarded in the past.

Animal Ownership—

Breeding Animals: Must have been owned by and under the management and direct care of the exhibitor for no less than thirty (30) consecutive days prior to opening day of the Fair

Market Animals: Must have been owned by and under the management and direct care of the exhibitor for at least:

- Lamb, Hog & Goat—sixty (60) consecutive days prior to opening day of Fair
- Beef—one hundred twenty (120) consecutive days prior to opening day of the Fair
- Poultry/Rabbits—(30) consecutive days before the Meat Pens are judged

Information available from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission indicates approximately 71,500 people were treated in hospitals for fishing injuries during 2007. Most of the injuries (about 70%) were puncture wounds resulting from fishhooks becoming imbedded in the skin and particularly in fingers. In addition, fishing injuries may also occur by slipping or tripping along banks or falling into water. Many injuries may be caused by error or inattention and could have been prevented by handling fishhooks and fishing tackle with greater care and maintaining a heightened awareness of potential fishing hazards. 

The 2010 State Leadership Conference "Operation 4-H" brings together high school youth from across California in a four day leadership training, networking, and learning experience.




The Conference provides advanced leadership training for high school 4 -H members. The Conference is an opportunity for 4-H members to network and share ideas with other 4-Hers from across the state.

4-H Booth at the 2010 California State Fair



4-H member and leaders are invited to help staff the booth and share experiences and projects with the public. Fore each person that is scheduled for a two-hour shift, the State Fair provides a ticket for 1 day of admission and parking passes as needed. The parking passes are valid in the livestock parking lot **Z** behind the fairgrounds (gravel road with unpaved parking).

Please wear clothing that identifies you with 4-H. A sign in and out sheet is posted near the booth in order to keep track of the staffing schedule. Volunteers are expected to keep the booth lean and the brochure holder filled from the supplies under the counter. No food is allowed in the booth.

The booth has a counter (about 1 1/2 ft x 4 ft) available to hold your 4-H project work or displays. Please sure that what you bring fits in this space. The State Fair will not hang or display any exhibit or project work, and takes no responsibility for any 4-H member's display item or animal. Only small animals will be allowed in the 4-H booth. Be sure the animal has a cage with a solid removable bottom (for cleaning purposes) and that it visibly has water at all times. The State Fair takes no responsibility for 4-H animals. The State Fair will not allow any birds (fowl) on the grounds that are not already cleared for participation at the State Fair.

RECORD BOOK FORMAT

Primary Members

Prepare your Record Book using the Primary member Personal Development forms. You also need to include a Project Report form for each of your projects. You may include pictures, letters, and articles as Junior and Senior Members do. Primary members are not evaluated, but they will receive participation awards. Unfortunately, work completed as a primary member does not count once you become a junior member.

Junior & Senior Members

Be sure to use the most current Record Book Manual. Prepare your record Book using the Personal Development Report form (PDR), Project Report forms, pictures, letters, and articles. To be really competitive, you must complete any supplemental forms for your project, such as Livestock Records, etc. Only Senior members may submit their books for State judging.

Creating an Outstanding 4-H Story

Your 4-H Story is a very important part of your 4-H record. Your 4-H Story should convey to your readers what you have done and learned by participating in 4-H:

The following outline may help you in developing your story:

- **Part 1:** Introduce yourself: include your age; interests and hobbies; when and why did you join 4-H.
- **Part 2:** Tell about the projects you've taken; why did you choose the projects you participated in; what goals did you set and which ones did you reach; what you have learned from your projects/activities?
- **Part 3:** How has 4-H helped you to become a better leader and citizen: describe the most important offices you held and committee assignments you accepted; how have you contributed to 4-H, the community, and your school; what have you learned from working with other 4-Hers?
- **Part 4:** How has 4-H participation influenced your school and career goals; what has being a 4-H member meant to you; what are you plans for the future?

Your story should be no more than six pages. Don't forget to proof read and spell check it!

4-H Record Book Tips

- 1. Be as neat as possible.
- 2. Be consistent and complete.
- 3. Be concise, well rounded, and condense when possible.
- 4. Don't repeat.
- 5. Limit pictures of project, activities, and leadership to three pages. Before and after pictures of a project are excellent.
- Communicate well. Individuals are judged through their book.
- 7. Leadership is very important.
- 8. Awards, ribbons, and champions with project work does not always mean a top 4-H member.
- 9. Make your story an interesting as possible.
- 10. Keep your record book in the proper order.
- 11. Your record book should be up to date.
- 12. The Annual Project Report should summarize each project.
- 13. A 4-H Personal Development Report contains all 4-H member activities.
- 14. Plastic covers over pages, pictures, etc, should <u>not</u> be used as they make judging difficult
- 15. Keep all your records from year-to-year for future reference.
- Understand what 4-H has to offer and the importance of keeping record when applying for Star Ranks, scholarships, college, jobs, etc.
