
2011 Fashion Revue

Part 2: Tell about the projects you have taken, goals, what you have learned. Part 3: How has 4-H helped you to become a better leader
member. Junior & Senior Members Be sure to use the most current Record Book Manual. Prepare your record book using the Personal Development Report form (PDR), Project Report forms, pictures, letters, and arti- cles. To be really competitive, you must complete any supple- mental forms for your project, such as Livestock Records, etc. Only Senior members may submit their books for state judging.	 and citizen: describe the most important offices you held and committee assignments you accepted; how you contributed to 4-H, the community, and your school; what have you learned from working with other 4-Hers? Part 4: How has 4-H Participation influenced your school and career goals; what has being a 4-H member meant to you; what are your plans for the future? Your story should be no more then six pages. 2011 4-H National Youth Science Experiment Wired for Wind

The 2011 National Science Experiment is Wired for Wind, an in-depth look at renewable energy technologies in the form of wind-power. This three-tiered experiment will help 4-H young

people to enhance their science, engineering, technology and applied math skills by allowing them to:



- Design, build and test two different wind turbine models,
- Experiment with variable by examining three different blade pitch angles to determine the effect of pitch or rotor speed.
- Relate their scientific experiences back to their own lives by determining how their communities can harness the power of wind and create a more sustainable and clean energy system, and
- Determine the best location for a potential wind farm in their state or local area by calculating wind power and studying wind data and maps.
