

Policy Reminders and Updates

New 4-H Banking Policy (704.2): As of July 1, 2008 all Sutter-Yuba 4-H club units are required by UCCE to *change the mailing address* on their monthly bank account statements (both checking and savings accounts) to be mailed to the Sutter/Yuba Counties Cooperative Extension office. The bank statements will be copied and forwarded immediately to the respective club contact. All clubs must also *remove* the UCCE County Director, Mike Murray from the account as a signatory. All address changes must be completed by **September 30, 2008.**

<u>Telephone Tree</u>: Contact Committee and Council members as reminder to attend meetings.




In the Spotlight



2008 State 4-H Record Book Competition



Time Line:

September 30, 2008 - Applications to Judge Due

October 24, 2008 - Books Due to County 4-H Office

December 5 - 7, 2008 - State Judging

The Purpose of Record Book Competitions:

- Provides an incentive to members to record their project work and personal achievement in their 4-H Record Book.
- Members receive feedback and encouragement on their 4-H project skill development, leadership and citizenship development, and record-keeping skills.
- Members are recognized for outstanding 4-H work.

Age Eligibility for the 2008 Competition:

Senior 4-H members (at least 14 years of age and no older than 19 years old by December 31 of the program year for which the book is being entered) are eligible to enter state competition. This means that 4-H members born anytime in 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, or 1993 (*between January 1, 1989 and December 31, 1993*) are eligible.

State 4-H Cover Page - The State 4-H Judging Cover Page must be included with 4-H Record Books entered for State Judging. The Cover Page may not be altered. 4-H Record Books missing the Cover Page will be reason for disqualification.

County Check Sheet - A county check sheet must be included with 4-H Record Books entered for State Judging. A committee, authorized by the County 4-H Office, must complete the checklist and ensure the completeness of the 4-H Record Book. 4-H Record Books missing the Check Sheet will be reason for disqualification.

Previous Years Materials - Materials from all previous years in 4-H must be removed and replaced with a summary of your previous involvement in 4-H (the 4-H member may include all involvement as a 4-H member, including primary). These pages must be placed at the back of the 4-H Record Book and must conform to the standard formatting and page guidelines.

Shotgun Discipline Ukiah, CA October 18 - 19, 2008 Cost \$30



A shotgun trainer course will be held 9:00am-5:00pm, Saturday and Sunday, October 18-19, 2008 at the Ukiah Gun Club, in Mendocino County. Upon successful completion of this two-day course, participants will be certified as 4-H leader trainers, and will be eligible to serve as shooting sports project leaders, as well as instruct and certify other volunteers in the discipline of shotgun. The course fee of \$30 includes shotgun shells, clay targets, continental breakfast and lunch both days, and class materials. Teen Leaders may attend, with a participating adult volunteer. Limited camping space is available, contact John Holder for arrangements. The course will be limited to twenty (20) participants. You must be an appointed 4-H volunteer or member to attend this training. 
